RE: FIFTIETH WALES COVID-19 UPDATE

Dear Family Members,

I would like to thank you for your continued support during this challenging time! Please read the below COVID-19-related updates.

Vaccinations:

The CIUSSS recently informed us that the CHSLD residents will receive their second Moderna dose on Wednesday, May 5th and the RPA residents will receive their second vaccine ninety to 112 days after their first dose. Please see the decisional tree on the following page for instructions on vaccinations for those who have previously tested positive for COVID-19.

Visiting:

There are no changes to the visitor policies, including that primary caregivers' visits are still restricted to the resident's room. Primary caregivers are authorized to go outside with their loved one while respecting the following regulations:

- Primary caregivers must register at door number one.
- Primary caregivers and residents must go directly outside; stopping to visit in common areas is prohibited.
- Both the resident and primary caregiver must wear a mask even while outside.

Please note that primary caregivers *and* employees must wear a face covering when entering the building which must be replaced by a clean procedural mask provided by the Wales upon entry.



Decisional tree - number of doses of vaccine to be administered to people who have been infected with COVID-19



- 1. To learn more about recommended interval, consult PIQ.
- 2. If the person has had COVID-19 in the past three months, they can make another vaccine appointment respecting the 3-month interval as recommended, or receive their vaccine today.
- 3. It is not dangerous to administer 2 doses of vaccine to this person. The risk of undesirable side effects is greater and the 2nd dose will not offer them increased protection.
