RE: FIFTY-NINTH WALES COVID-19 UPDATE

Dear Family Members,

Yesterday, I spoke with an administrator of a senior's residence that unfortunately had to deal with positive COVID-19 cases. He shared his experience and said that he would not wish this nightmare on his worst enemy. Although we feel confident that the worst is behind us, we cannot be naïve and let our guard down; we worked very hard to keep the beast at bay and we must continue to work together to stay safe.

The government once again announced the lessening of certain measures. Changes are highlighted in yellow in the table below, including new distancing regulations from *two metres* to *one*.

I am proud to announce that the week of July 26th, 2021, the Wales will once again sign a contract with the CIUSSS for twelve intermediate care beds. This partnership and newly renovated Central unit will allow the Wales to offer a complete continuum of care for those who are completely independent to those requiring specialized services. This unit's opening will be a different experience for our team as professional services will be provided by the CIUSSS.

Public Health still recommends that seniors' facilities use Visit Coordinators, thus we must request that you adhere to the designated hours:

- Thursdays from 9:00 a.m. until 12:00 p.m., 12:45 p.m. until 5:00 p.m., and 5:45 p.m. until 8:00 p.m.
- Friday to Wednesday from 9:00 a.m. until 12:00 p.m. and 12:45 p.m. until 5:00 p.m.

Please note that the Visit Coordinator is *not* at their post during resident mealtimes and their breaks, daily from:

- 10:00 a.m. until 10:15 a.m.
- 12:00 p.m. until 12:45 p.m.
- 3:00 p.m. until 3:15 p.m.

On Thursdays, the supper break is from 5:00 p.m. until 5:45 p.m. If you wish to continue visiting during these time periods, please note that you will have to wait to leave the building until the Visit Coordinator returns so you can sign out properly as per Public Health regulations.

^{*}PRIMARY CAREGIVERS are essential visitors who provide direct care to residents. They may include family members or friends who support daily living activities, cognitive stimulation, communication, meaningful connections, and decision-making assistance.

PPE: personal protective equipment.

PCI training: prevention and control of infection training.

PLEASE NOTE: since the Wales has two entities, the CHSLD and the RPA, and shares common areas for residents like the Therapy Room and Therapeutic Pool, and employees from both entities share break rooms, we must apply Public Health measures for CHSLDs since this entity has more beds than the RPA.

^{**}VISITORS are persons who wish to visit but are not considered primary caregivers.
