## RE: FIFTY-SIXTH WALES COVID-19 UPDATE

Dear Family Members,

We are finally seeing some normalcy return to our lives! Flowers are blooming, the sun is shining, the pond is stocked with fish, the Petting Zoo animals are now back onsite, and our Activity Department is busy coordinating upcoming group events. Having the residents sharing meals together in the Main Dining Room again is truly wonderful. I am not sure who was more excited, the residents or the employees! Hearing the residents' chatter and witnessing our employees' hustle and excitement as they served the residents was remarkable. LIFE IS GOOD!

The government once again announced the lessening of certain measures as the Estrie transitions to the Yellow Zone on Monday, June 14<sup>th</sup>. Changes are highlighted in yellow in the table below. We feel confident that the situation in the Estrie will continue to improve, therefore the deconfinement measures will once again change on June 28<sup>th</sup>. Despite our sigh of relief, we must remain cautious until this pandemic is over. Thank you for your cooperation as we transition through the deconfinement measures.

Effective, Monday, June 14<sup>th</sup>, the shelving unit at Door Number One will be removed. Families and visitors will be expected to deliver items directly to the residents' rooms.

Effective August 1st, virtual visits coordinated through the Wales will be offered only to family members who live outside of the province. Our System Administrator is currently working on two time-consuming projects which have been postponed due to the pandemic. Until further notice, virtual visits will be maintained.

The CIUSSSE-CHUS will come to the CHSLD Wales Inc. to administer one of our residents' second dose of the COVID-19 vaccination. After this resident is fully immunized, the Wales will have only one unvaccinated resident and one employee.

In closing, I would like to thank our residents, employees, volunteers, and partners for their patience, cooperation, dedication, and hard work over the past year and a half as we faced the many challenges brought on by COVID-19. Please note that the resident counts as one address and the homeowner counts as the second).</li> <li>Respect a two-meter distance. Must wear a mask when distancing is not possible.</li> </ul>	
Visits to family members' or friends' homes (private gatherings) <u>OUTSIDE</u>	<ul> <li>PERMITTED</li> <li>Must follow Public Health regulations for the general population (maximum of eight people or two addresses including the resident).</li> <li>Respect a two-meter distance. Must wear a mask when distancing is not possible.</li> </ul>

<sup>\*</sup>PRIMARY CAREGIVERS are essential visitors who provide direct care to residents. They may include family members or friends who support daily living activities, cognitive stimulation, communication, meaningful connections, and decision-making assistance.

PPE: personal protective equipment

PCI training: prevention and control of infection training

PLEASE NOTE: since the Wales has two entities, the CHSLD and the RPA, and shares common areas for residents like the Therapy Room and Therapeutic Pool, and employees from both entities share break rooms, we must apply Public Health measures for CHSLDs since this entity has more beds than the RPA.

<sup>\*\*</sup>VISITORS are persons who wish to visit but are not considered primary caregivers.
