RE: FIFTY-SEVENTH WALES COVID-19 UPDATE

Dear Family Members,

Our collective efforts are paying off; the Estrie will transition from the Yellow to Green Level on the COVID-19 Regional Alert and Gradual Response System. The changes are highlighted in yellow in the table below and take effect on Monday, June 28th, 2021.

If you are vaccinated against COVID-19 but did not receive proof of vaccination, please visit https://covid19.quebec.ca/PreuveVaccinale. You will be able to download your Quick Response (QR) code proof that you can either print or save on your mobile device.

Visitors *must* register in the visitor log at Door Number One, *even* when visiting outside. If multiple people are visiting at the same time, *each* visitor must sign the log, *including* children. Primary caregivers and visitors visiting in groups must be monitored by the Visit Coordinator, therefore these visits are designated at Door Number One *only*. Individual visits can be done anywhere on the Wales grounds. When visiting *outside* and while *seated*, residents and visitors can remove their mask *if* they maintain a two-metre distance. If not and when circulating, masks must be worn.

To access the back of the Wales, including the petting zoo and pond, CHSLD primary caregivers and visitors are authorized to use Door Number Nine in the Main Living Room Solarium. Remaining in the Main Living Room is not permitted, as the space is designated for residents. While circulating to Door Number Nine, please make sure you distance from others and go straight outside.

Recently, a still-smoking cigarette butt was found in the mulch by the Visitor Parking Lot. Thankfully, a Maintenance Department employee noticed that the mulch was smouldering and watered the area several times to ensure a fire would not ignite. Please treat our property as you would like yours treated. Thank you for your cooperation.

The CHSLD Wales recently revised its policy on personal fridges. The new policy allows residents to have a small compact fridge of no more than 2.7 cubic feet in their rooms. Perishable foods brought in by visitors will no longer be kept in the Wales fridges. Temperature monitoring, disposal of expired food, and cleaning procedures will be completed by the resident or their family member. If residents and their families do not comply with the policy, the right to own a personal fridge will be suspended. A copy of the full policy can be viewed in the July edition of *The Chatter*.

Primary caregivers, visitors, and external service providers <u>must</u> receive a training on the use of Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) prior to visiting or providing services to Wales residents. The Visit Coordinator <i>must</i> be at Door Number One when visitors sign in and out. If visitors stay during meals, therefore, they must wait for the Visit Coordinator's return prior to leaving the building. Visitors must be outside the building BEFORE the end of visiting hours, so prior to 8:00 p.m. on Thursdays and before 5:00 p.m. any other day.

People from different addresses must be able to respect a two-meter distance from each other and from the resident to be permitted to visit at the same time in a resident's room. Masks must be worn constantly.

Visits inside the building in common areas including the dining rooms, hallways, and living rooms	 PERMITTED Must respect measures including hand hygiene, wearing a mask, and two-metre distancing from others. While respecting measures, visitors can accompany residents to their dining room before leaving, however no visitor eating is permitted. 	
Outdoors, on the Wales grounds	 Appointments are STRONGLY recommended, otherwise there is no guarantee of available space for outdoor visitation. To book an appointment, please call Erica at 819-826-3266 extension 248. Up to TWO thirty-minute spots can be booked. Maximum of NINE people, including primary caregivers* and visitors** AT A TIME, at designated spaces ONLY, as employee supervision is required. Group outdoor visits are authorized at Door Number One ONLY, at the picnic tables or lounge area, and each visitor must register in the visitor log. No limit of visits per resident per day. Wear a mask OR maintain a two-metre distance constantly.

^{*}PRIMARY CAREGIVERS are essential visitors who provide direct care to residents. They may include family members or friends who support daily living activities, cognitive stimulation, communication, meaningful connections, and decision-making assistance.

PPE: personal protective equipment

PCI training: prevention and control of infection training

PLEASE NOTE: since the Wales has two entities, the CHSLD and the RPA, and shares common areas for residents like the Therapy Room and Therapeutic Pool, and employees from both entities share break rooms, we must apply Public Health measures for CHSLDs since this entity has more beds than the RPA.
