## RE: FIFTY-FIFTH WALES COVID-19 UPDATE

Dear Family Members,

We have exciting news to share with you today! This weekend, the government announced the lessening of certain measures in Orange Zones. Changes are highlighted in yellow in the table.

Please note that RPA residents will resume eating in the Main Dining Room at full capacity on Wednesday, June 9<sup>th</sup> at noon. We are so excited that our residents will be able to eat together once more! This transition will understandably require extensive coordination, as each four-person table will form a group that will be able to use the elevator together. Please note that, consequently, seating arrangement may differ from pre-pandemic times.

## **Outdoor Visits:**

Please note that during the current heat wave, outdoor visits are cancelled until further notice.

## **Vaccinations**

Vaccinations in RPAs are now complete across Québec. If any RPA residents have not received their second dose, they will have to schedule their appointment through Clic Santé at <a href="https://portal3.clicsante.ca/">https://portal3.clicsante.ca/</a>.

If the situation in the Estrie continues to improve, the deconfinement measures will be changing every two weeks. Although we are extremely encouraged by the deconfinement's progression, we also wish to remain extremely vigilant until this pandemic is officially in the past. <sup>\*</sup>PRIMARY CAREGIVERS are essential visitors who provide direct care to residents. They may include family members or friends who support daily living activities, cognitive stimulation, communication, meaningful connections, and decision-making assistance.

<u>PPE</u>: personal protective equipment

PCI training: prevention and control of infection training

PLEASE NOTE: since the Wales has two entities, the CHSLD and the RPA, and shares common areas for residents like the Therapy Room and Therapeutic Pool, and employees from both entities share break rooms, we must apply Public Health measures for CHSLDs since this entity has more beds than the RPA.
