## REGARDING: 150<sup>TH</sup> WALES COVID-19 UPDATE

Since our last update, one Norton 1, one Norton 2, and one Shaw 1 resident tested positive for COVID-19. These residents are self-isolating to their rooms for ten days. Two of their tablemates tested negative but are preventively isolating to their rooms for five days. Norton 1 currently has twenty-one positive cases, Norton 2 has four, and Shaw 1 has one; this case is unrelated to our CHSLD outbreaks.

Eight employees are currently positive for the virus, and one is pending results, constituting forty-one missing shifts per week. Although this staffing situation has greatly improved compared to last week, these missing shifts still put a great strain on our schedule and thus essential care will continue to be prioritized; scheduled baths and changing residents out of their pajamas may be done later than usual.

Employees from the testing centre were onsite today to perform a mass testing on Norton 1 and 2 residents and employees. The table below contains the statistics on who was tested:

Norton 2	28/32 = 88%	4/32 = 13%	16

Total	38/64 = 59%	26/64 = 41%	45

I will issue another letter tomorrow with the above table updated to include result statistics.

Please remember you can still visit your COVID-19-positive loved ones; you simply need to wear proper personal protective equipment. If you have not previously done so, please ask an employee on your loved one's unit; they will be happy to demonstrate. Wales visit regulations remain the same:

- Wear a mask to enter the building
- Change to a clean procedural one provided by the Wales at the entrances
- Keep the procedural mask over your nose and mouth for your entire visit
  - As you cannot remove your mask while at the Wales, eating and drinking are *not* permitted
    masks cannot be lowered for *any* reason
- Frequent hand hygiene is important, either with soap and water in the resident's room, suite, or apartment or hand sanitizer, located throughout the common areas
